


1/11/2014 AT BELLAIRE


Kris' Report: This was a very special sharing event, almost like a mini Christmas event. We had lots of volunteers, music program, lots of food, clothing, and gift drawing.

When I shopped for food for the event, I was inspired to prepare more food than usual, so I obeyed and prepared enough food for 36 people, while on the inside, I thought to myself that we'd have lots of leftovers after the event based on prior experience at this location. 
