When Paco finished, we had gotten the phone numbers of three or four workers who accepted Christ that day.

New Location: West Park Drive between Southwest Freeway and Chimney Rock

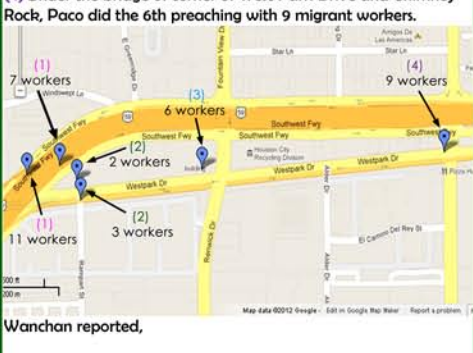
6/30/12

Selina Hsieh and Allen Yu brought food and drink and prepared the gospel tracts.

Paco did preaching 6 times in one morning.

- (1) Beside and under the bridge of intersection of Southwest Freeway and Westpark Dr.: in total 18 migrant workers in two preaching events.
- (2) Around the gas station and around the corner of Westpark Dr. and Rampart St., Paco did sharing twice with 5 migrant workers totally;
- (3) Along the street of West Park Drive, close to Fountain View, Paco did the fifth sharing with 7 workers;
- (4) Under the bridge of corner of West Park Drive and Chimney Rock, Paco did the 6th preaching with 9 migrant workers.



Wanchan reported,

Paco used his loudest voice to compete against highly noisy passing cars to do preaching to 18 migrant workers both beside and under the bridge of intersection of Southwest Freeway and Westpark Dr. Without deep passion for God's kingdom, no one would dare to challenge such deafening noises. How can we share gospel fruitfully under such adverse circumstances?

Yet, He is a Miracle Performer. He can sow his "magic seeds" into these peoples' hearts.

After these two exhaustive sharing, Paco felt he lost most of voice. Yet, when we were passing by two groups of migrant workers, Paco started to preach again. With his exhausted voice, Paco continued preaching and did not want to stop for a minute.

Then we stopped at the cross road of Fountain View and West Park Drive. Paco preached to 9 workers along the West Park Drive. A young man followed me when I invited him for food and drink. His face showed expression of embarrassment; yet his right hand unconsciously pressed his stomach, trying to calm down the "grumbling" sound inside his stomach.

After this sharing event, the sky became very cloudy and then big rain started to fall. We decided to pay a short visit only to the last possible spot, under the bridge around the cross road of West Park and Chimney Rock.



A group of people were already there sharing gospel with about 9-10 migrant workers. I immediately recognized among them Tom, a Korean man who used to stay in South America and was fluent in Spanish. I met Tom three years ago when we just started HIMN. Tom is a missionary with a passion especially on migrant workers. He had done the mission works for more than 10 years when I met him last time. Three years later, he still stays in this mission field. His faithfulness is very inspiring. May God bless his faithful worker.

After Tom's group left, Paco continued preaching to these 9 migrant workers. The rain now became very violent. Everybody got wet. The bridge could not keep us from becoming soaking wet.

Yet, Paco did not stop. Neither did these 9 migrant workers. The preaching continued. The 9 workers continued. To avoid the big rain, they kept switching to different spots. Yet, the preaching continued and the workers continued until the end.

We were thrilled to have such an experience. We all felt that we just went through a spiritual violent storm. However, we came out fruitfully.

Selina and her son Allen stayed faithful all the time, even though they were new to this ministry. May God bless them abundantly!
