10/5/2013 SHARING EVENT AT WEST PARK

Andrew's Report:

I arrived at the West Park location at 8:20 AM. Kris was already there. Jessica arrived at 8:40 and Graciela arrived at 8:50. Kris began our time with a word of prayer. We began to pass out tracts and the bottled water that Kris brought. Jessica and Graciela passed out the donuts that they brought and began to share with the workers under the bridge.

After sharing with the workers under the bridge, we then went to the Shell gas station to share with the rest of the workers. We stood under a tree and kept our sharing time short so that the owners of the Shell gas station would not notice and force us to leave. We ended our time at 9:30 with a closing prayer.

I think we need to pray for the Shell gas station at the West Park location. Either we need to talk to the owner of the gas station into letting us minister to the workers there or we need to find another location to minister to the workers. Graciela suggested that we go to another place to minister to the migrant workers. She told us that she recognizes many of the workers that we ministered to that day. Furthermore, the owners of the Shell gas station are still very hostile to us ministering to the migrant workers standing on their property. Please pray for this situation.

Kris' Report:

Andrew and I arrived at the location around 8:30AM and Jessica and Graciela arrived shortly after. Graciela brought donuts and I brought bottled water for the migrant workers.

All gathered and prayed for the event and for the migrant workers we were to reach. We thanked God for allowing us to be a part of His ministry and prayed for the workers we were about to reach that day, that they would see the glory of God, know their sins, and their need to receive the salvation of the Christ.

We gathered a group of ten migrant workers immediately and served them donuts and water. Graciela and Jessica spoke to them about God's love for them while I was praying for Jessica, Graciela, and these migrant workers. Graciela and Jessica spoke to them extensively and softly, with urgency and compassion. I thank God to have such wonderful coworkers in this ministry.

We hesitated before crossing the road to the Shell gas station because of the prior warnings from the station employees to stay off their property. But seeing so many unsaved souls there, we simply could not resist and proceeded to crossing the road to them. We stayed on the far side of the parking lot and gathered eleven migrant workers. We served them donuts and water and since some of these men did not show interest in listening to Graciela, she spoke to a few men individually.

It was a great day serving the Lord, the weather was beautiful and the migrant workers were mostly friendly to us. I continue to pray to God that our message and actions sowed the seeds in their hearts and that soon they would realize their need for Jesus Christ.

10/12/2013 SHARING EVENT AT WOODRIDGE
